
## Woodburn Primary School Newsletter -P5/6D

## **Our Class Charter**

- 5. We have the right to be listened to if we have broken rules.
- 6. We have the right to expect lessons which challenge us, and help us develop our skills, abilities and personalities.

Our charter will continue to underpin behaviour and attitude in our classroom throughout the school year.

In addition to this, some P6 pupils will be attending skiing lessons at Hillend, escorted by Mr Borthwick and Miss Hutchison.


