Our main focus this session is a literature Study. P5F are studying the novel *The Firework Maker's Daughter*. This will link very closely to the work we will be doing with Emotion Works and work through themes of courage, friendship and family. Throughout our novel study we will partake in lots of drama and put ourselves into the shoes of the main characters within the story. We will also use our Book Detective skills to investigate and study the story in detail.

This term we will also be looking at sustaining our world and how we can work as a class/school to ensure we live and work in a more sustainable way. We will also look at various inventions that have helped to develop our world in a more sustainable way.

Within Health and Wellbeing we will be participating in the Emotion Works Programme. This term we will be focusing on the language of emotions and how we respond to different emotions.

In French we will be revising numbers to 31 and will be focusing on learning the months and to say the date.

In Citizenship Gatherings and Blether Buddy sessions we will revisit our Woodburn Learning Skills and continue our work on raising awareness of Global issues/ concerns.

Numeracy and Maths

Work in Numeracy this term will be to extend our knowledge of basic facts, develop our skills and understanding of various strategies used in calculations and deepen our knowledge of number facts. We will work on applying our skills to real life problems within a context.

In Maths we will focus on measurement and using instruments to measure using different units. We will look at measuring length, mass and capacity. We will also look at angles and position and movement linking them to the 4 compass points.

This term will include Scottish Maths focus week. Throughout Maths week, children will look at problem solving and putting their Maths and numeracy skills into a context.

Literacy and English Reading

We will be studying the novel *'The Firework Maker's Daughter'* and study how the author builds and develops different settings throughout the story and how these effect the reader. Throughout we will also be looking at the author's techniques and choice of language.

Writing

We will be looking at story writing and following Talk 4 Writing where the children will study a short journey/quest story. They will be learning a range of strategies to support them in structuring and creating their own journey story.

Listening and Talking

Through our novel study we will be asking and responding to a range of questions which will include a variety of question types. They will also be encouraged to express their ideas and opinions using evidence from the text.

Ways you can support your child's learning by encouraging them:

- to practise tables and the relationship between multiplication and division
- to take responsibility for their own organisation
- to read a selection of books for understanding and pleasure
- to practise spelling familiar words which they are still unsure of.
