# **Primary 7K**

In P7K, actions for adults as duty bearers are:

Ask for our thoughts and opinions, listen to them and take them seriously.

Ensure activities and lessons are adapted to suit the needs of all individuals.

Ensure our classroom is a safe environment to work in.

Support and encourage us to do our very best and reach our potential.

Respect our privacy and confidentiality, only reporting to others in order to keep us safe.

Please support your child by reading over this with them at home.

We will begin the session with our novel study which we hope the children will really enjoy and it will allow us to create some interesting work. We will also investigate technological developments in society and business and the children will be given a group challenge to focus on.

Within Health and Well being, we will focus on developing relationships and learning who and how to receive support from in challenging times.

In French and Spanish we will focus on greetings and basic conversation and learn the vocabulary for some classroom instructions.

Children will be introduced to 'Seesaw' which will allow us to share the children's learning digitally with parents/carers.

In Citizenship Gatherings and in class, we will revisit our Woodburn Learning Skills and continue our work on raising awareness of Global issues/concerns. We will also revise the language of learning and the various ways in which we learn.

#### P.E.

## **Numeracy and Maths**

Work in Numeracy this term will be to extend our knowledge of basic facts, develop our skills and understanding of various strategies used in calculations and deepen our knowledge of number facts. We will work on applying our skills to real life problems within a context.

We will also continue to develop our knowledge and skills in measure, angle, symmetry and transformation

This term will include Scottish maths focus week. Throughout maths week, children will look at problem solving skills throughout all areas of the curriculum.

## Literacy and English

#### Reading

We will be studying the novel 'Percy Jackson and the lightning thief' by Rick Riordan and study how the author develops themes and relationships between characters through his use of language.

## Writing

We will be looking at the features of manifestos and creating our own. We will also focus on discursive writing and write about issues which have differing opinions. We will introduce children to the 'Talk for Writing' approach to creative writing.

# **Listening and Talking**

We will be listening to how debates are carried out in the debating chamber of the Scottish Parliament and then demonstrate our own skills in listening to and voicing opinions.
